Canstruction's impact internationally

- What is the idea and purpose behind Canstruction?

Canstruction® is an international hunger campaign that's distributed millions of pounds of food to local food banks through our unique design/build Competitions and exhibitions.

Founded in 1992, the event is now held across the US, Canada, Australia, Europe, China and South America. It is the largest international food drive with more than 150 competitions annually.

The organizations primary mission is to highlight the issue of hunger in our community, collect food for distribution to thousands of hungry people and to shine a spotlight on the design/build industry.





Impact on Hunger in Southwest Virginia







Cans from the 2016 sculptures and Peoples' Choice donations added up to more than 17,000 lbs. of food – **providing more than 14,000 meals for the hungry.**

Timeline

October 19:	Deadline for participation commitment
Mid-December:	Teams send designs and can orders to Cindy Peterson (be sure to provide cansculpture dimensions)
February 26:	Can Load-in
March 1:	Teams build structures, start time 12 p.m. end time 12 a.m.
March 2:	Jury: 9:00 – 11:00 a.m. Opening and Awards Ceremony: 2:00 p.m.
March 2-17:	Cansculpture exhibit is open to the public during regular Taubman hours
March 17:	Take down cansculptures, box cans 5:00 – 7:00 PM. Teams will dismantle the cansculptures. Volunteers will aid clean-up.





Jury

- Completely independent and not connected to any team
- Select winners in 5 categories the morning after build
- No signage identifying firms / teams
- No team members present



Team Responsibility Highlights

- Submit your design and can order on schedule by December __??___
- Pay for your cans on <u>schedule</u> prior to event / delivery
- Build day: unbox your team's cans
- Break-down day: carefully take apart your cansculpture and deliver boxes to designated area
- Help clean up after build and after break-down





Rules: Team Rule Highlights

- Any number of people may participate in design
- Only 5 team members are allowed to build at any given time
- 6th teammate allowed to unbox cans
- Team members may swap out at any time in order to give as many people as possible an opportunity to build
- Other teammates are not allowed to unbox food, cut foam core, etc.





Rules: Material and Size Requirement Highlights

- Use CANS!
- Don't rely on boxes, bags or props
- Maximum size is 10'W x 10'L x 10'H
- Must be structurally self-supporting

- **See 2018 Rules and Regulations for a full list of permitted/non-permitted items
- Use of ¼" thick materials (foam core, cardboard, masonite, plywood, plexi, etc.) are for leveling only, not bearing weight
- Tape, rubber bands, wire, Velcro, magnets, zipties, nylon string and ¼" threaded rod may be used
- Labels must remain intact and cannot be covered, damaged or altered
- NO junk food or pet food, glass containers or alcoholic beverages, NO expired food or beverage. NO empty cans or plastic bottles/containers.
- "Purest"-looking structures, where evidence of non-food materials does not show, fare better with the jurors
